

Saul Molho (1898-?): He got married in Thessaloniki. He returned from Auschwitz. His wife and daughter were murdered there. Got married again in Thessaloniki.

Jacques (Hebrew name: Yitzchak) Molho (?-1980): He got married to Daisy in Grenoble (France) and had a daughter. His wife was Christian. She died of a heart attack during the occupation by the Nazis, while their child was brought to Spain. Jacques returned from Auschwitz and went around all Spain looking for his daughter. He never managed to find her; he returned to France and got married again.

Alberto Molho (?-?): Uncle Alberto was the brother of my father who did not want to leave Thessaloniki. He was deported to Auschwitz with his wife and two children. He was the only one to survive, later remarried and had a son, Joseph.

Charles Molho (?-?): He lived in Brussels (Belgium) and survived Auschwitz. He got married in Belgium pre-war. He survived fro Auschwitz and returned to Belgium. He had no children.

Dario Molho (?-1940s): He died of typhus in Auschwitz.

Lisa and Bella Molho (Twins): Lisa Molho got married in Thessaloniki. Her, her husbands and their children were murdered in Auschwitz. Bella Molho got married and had made aliyah in 1930. Died in Israel in 1980.

Gracia Molho (?-1940s): She got married in Thessaloniki. Gracia and her husband were murdered in Auschwitz. She had no children.

Mois Molho (?-1920s): He committed suicide for romantic reasons.

In the ghetto (Thessaloniki). Then he was deported and murdered in Auschwitz.



Sylvia Cohen (nee Moshe) (1910-1989): She got married to Pepo Cohen in 1927 and moved to Valencia (Spain) in 1930. Their children are Jaime (Jacob) Cohen and Leon Cohen. Jaime studied Chemistry and worked as Director Manager in big companies. Now he is retired and lives in Barcelona. Leon studied medicine and worked as a doctor in a surgery intensive care unit. Now he is retired and lives in the USA.

Jacob Florentin (?-1940s): We called him "Pasha" which is a Turkish word, because he was very handsome. His wife was Aunt Esterina and they had five children, two boys and three girls.

The oldest daughter, Sylvia, got married at the age of 14 in Paris. She only died three years ago.

The oldest son, Mevo, went to the army and the other son, Leon, was sent very young to Israel (then Palestine), to the first farm school during the British occupation there, that was around 1933.

The second daughter, Jeanne, was the same age as my older sister, she was born in 1919. They were also sharing the same milk as both mothers shared in breast feeding the two girls.

The youngest one, Dolly, was born in 1927.

Jacob, Esterina, Jeanne and Dolly Florentin were murdered in the Holocaust.
