

Forced labor: Bereck (today Romania) October 1942; Kilyen (today Romania), approximately until the end of May 1943; Podoboc (today Ukraine) from around June 1943; Budapest (Hungarian Royal Military Railway and Bridgework Depot from April 1944, then sometime during the summer he deserted, and from then on he served in the Clothes-collecting Company with fake papers

In hiding: Lovolde Square (yellow star house), Katona Jozsef Street (protected house)

What did you do after the Holocaust?

He graduated and worked as an engineer in different positions until his retirement.

Hungarian Royal Army: from 1911 one year service as officer, then World War I, Italian battlefield, he demobilized as first lieutenant, then he was called in for service as reservist officer several times, and in 1935 he was promoted to the rank of captain.
