
Family Tree

How religious was your parents' home? How were you raised? My parents were religious. We observed Jewish traditions and followed the kashrut at home. My parents went to the synagogue on Sabbath and Jewish holidays, celebrated Sabbath and Jewish holidays at home.

What is your mother tongue? Yiddish

Evacuation: Pogiblovka, Gorky region (today Russia), later Andijon (today Uzbekistan)

Returned to Ludza, one year later went to study in Riga. After finishing her studies, she lived and worked in Riga.
