The atmosphere there was wonderful. I loved going there a lot. There were three large rooms in the house that impressed



me very much because I lived in a more humble lodging at that time. I loved to have breakfast on the sofra [a traditional low table] and eat popara [popular breakfast of crumbled bread and fresh milk].
