He was a vendor and a rather wealthy man, though he didn't provide any support for my mother and was just a relative in name. Unfortunately, this is all I know about my mother's family. In this town my mother became a dressmaker's apprentice. She went to work for a dressmaker where she was provided with boarding and meals.
