Mama observed the Sabbath and lit the candles regularly. We celebrated Easter [Pesach]. Our house was kosher, but towards the end [in the late 1930s] my parents definitely kept kosher but we [children] didn't: we mixed milk and meat. I was non-religious from 12 or 13, I think. I broke with religion very early on. I stopped going to the prayer house with father. I wasn't made to go. I didn't have a bar mitzvah. We didn't go to cheder or yeshivah.
