

Abram Borisovich (Berkovich) Levit, Leningrad;

Rachel Borisovna Goreva (nee: Levit), died in 1936 in Leningrad;

Fenya Borisovna Levit. Before the war lived with her husband in Leningrad. in 1941 was evacuated with the employees of the defense plant where her husband worked. Died in 1960-1970s.

Sophia Borisovna Kuzina (nee: Levit), lived in Leningrad, later in Narva, where her husband was the chief of construction of the Pre-Baltic Power Station. Lived in Pushkin and died there.

Bosya Borisovna Sakharova (nee: Levit), a teacher of the English language, died in Samara in 1999.

Brother Leib Semenovich Golshmid, 1902-1949, fought in the Great Patriotic War, was wounded in 1943, lost his leg, died in Leningrad;

Brother Alexander Lvovich (Leibovich) Golshmid, engineer-designer. Was heavily shell-shocked at the front in Nevskaya Dubrovka in 1941. Died in Leningrad in 1970-1980.
