

## What sort of work do/did you do?

Worked as a clerk in the firm before war, 1942 – 1948: military officer, from 1954 to 1978 was a deputy director of the factory of consumer services

## How religious was your parents' home? How were you raised?

Parents were religious. Jewish traditions were observed at home. On Sabbath and Jewish holidays father went to the synagogue. Mother went to the synagogue on Jewish holidays. We marked Sabbath and Jewish holidays at home, observed kashrut

What is your mother tongue? Russian

What other languages do you speak? Yiddish, German, Lettish *If you were in an army, tell us which army and the dates* 1942 – 1948: soviet army, cryptographer, military translator

## Where were you during the Holocaust?

1941: evacuation: kolkhoz in Yaroslavsk oblast, Kirov (now Vyatka) (Russia) 1941 – 1942: worked as a censor in Kirov (Russia) 1942 – 1945: cryptographer, military translator in the front (Russia, Ukraine, Moldova, Romania)

## What did you do after the Holocaust?

1945 – 1948: kept on serving in the army as a military translator After demobilization worked in the consumer services factory, raised sons
