

Where were you during the Holocaust?

September 1941-November 1943: I was evacuated from the Leningrad blockade with my mother. There I went to school and from March 1942 began working at a chemical laboratory at the same time. I worked as a junior laboratory assistant

1940- the city of Belozersk, Vologodsky Region

Where and when was he was born?

February 17, 1892 in the city of Elizavetpol, Azerbaijan (Until 1804 and from 1918-1935 the city was Gyandzha and from 1804-1918 –Elizavetpol, when the northern part of Azerbaijan became part of Russia. From 1935 the city was Kirovobad, and now (after the formation of the CIS) Gyandzha.

Where and when did he die?

Leningrad, May 12th, 1953 Buried in the Transfiguration Cemetery (Jewish cemetery)

What sort of education did he have?

In 1911 he graduated from gymnasium (not Jewish) in Elizavetpol (when he entered school is unknown)

1911-1914: Studied at the Medical Institute in Berlin and worked as a cellarer-meaning that he sold beer at a bar.

1914-1917: Department of medicine at the Kiev State University

What sort of work did he do?

Starting in 1934 he worked for a year or two in the factory "Red Vyborzhets" as a medical attendant (in Leningrad)

From 1935-1941: surgeon at a maternity hospital named after Snegirov and before the war he was the deputy head doctor.

1941-1945: Head doctor of the Snegirov maternity hospital

1945-1951: Acting head of gynecology at the Marinsky hospital.

What was his level of religiosity?

Atheist

What was his mother tongue?

Russian

Army service: Which army and what years?

1918-1933: Commander in the Red Army; Army doctor, second class

Tell me about his brothers and sisters. (name, date of birth and death, occupation, place of residence, etc.)

6 siblings

oldest daughter Eva: married, husband ship captain, then winemaker; lived in Kishinev from 1939; one daughter.

Ida: Lived her whole life in Gyandzha (Kirovobad); worked as a telegraphmist in the post office.

Adele: married very young and died while giving birth to her first child.

Roza: graduated from university, dentist, lived in Tashkent and was dentist at the governmental polyclinic.

Efim: graduated from the Polytechnic Institute in Rome; worked as a mechanic in the Baku oil fields, had a wife and 2 children; daughter oil chemist and doctor of technical science, end of 1970s moved to Miami, USA and died there; son, Vladimir, power engineer, lives in Ber Sheva, Israel, 2 daughters and 5 grandchildren.

Alexander: administrator in supply, 2 sons.

Where was he during the Holocaust?

In Leningrad. From 1935-1942 he worked as a surgeon at the Snegirova maternity hospital and was also the deputy head doctor.

1941-1945: Head doctor at the Snegirov maternity hospital (Leningrad)

If he survived, what did he do after?

1945-1951: Worked as the head of gynecology at the Marinsky Hospital in Leningrad.

Rozalia Josefovna Landa-Glaz (nee-Landa)

Where and when was she was born?

Bessarabia, September 12, 1895

Where and when did she die?

Leningrad, July 29th 1959

What sort of education did she have?

She finished gymnasium (not Jewish) with a gold medal (Years of study unknown)

1914-1917: Department of medicine at Kiev State University

She defended her Ph.D.thesis in biology in 1935 and became candidate of science

What sort of work did she do?

1935-1941: Worked at the Brain Institute as a scientist. Did biochemical research, experimented on animals, mostly on rabbits.

1941-1944: Worked at the military hospital in Tashkent (during the evacuations).

She was the head of the clinical laboratory and ran the head/brain trauma floor.

1944-1949: Leningrad. Senior scientist at the Medical Science Academy.

1949-1957: Laboratory technician at a clinical laboratory.

What was her level of religiosity?

Atheist

What was her mother tongue?

Russian

Tell me about her brothers and sisters. (name, date of birth and death, occupation, place of residence, etc.)

Henrik: doctor of medical science, venerologist-dermatologist; two children: daughter died at age of 12, son Garik graduated from the Military-Medical Academy in Samarkand and was killed in the war.

Boris: graduated from Pharmaceutical Institute, head pharmacist of a large pharmacy in Zhitomir; one daughter, Nyura who lives in or near New York.

Zinaida: librarian, 2 children: son lives in Donetsk, daughter lives in Israel.

Where was she during the Holocaust?

1935-1941: Leningrad; Worked at the Brain Institute as a scientist.

1941-1944: Tashkent, evacuation. Was the head of the clinical laboratory and ran the Head and brain trauma floor.

30th of January, 1944: Returned to Leningrad and worked as the senior scientist at the Medical Science Academy

If she survived, what did she do after?

1944-1949: Senior scientist at the Medical Science Academy (Leningrad)

1949-1957: Laboratory Assistant at a clinical laboratory in Leningrad

Ekaterina: 1892-1941, graduated from college, lawyer; moved to Leningrad where she was a member of the Leningrad coalition of lawyers and dealt with criminal cases; unmarried; in November 1941, murdered by a neighbor.

Rebecca: Born in Odessa in 1893, graduated of a medical institute; invented a whole list of vaccinations.

Where was she during the Holocaust?

Leninsk-Kuznetsk (Siberia, Kemerov Region) The dates and what she did are unknown.
