Unit: Europe **Topic:** Holocaust

Objective: We will be able to analyze a documentary about two young cousins who survived the Holocaust in order to extend our understanding of what we can learn from individual experiences of significant historical events.

Materials: Power Point, Post-Its, Questions/Graphic Organizers, documentary

Differentiation: Information is being presented through video and audio with additional written support material, self-selected differentiated focal and extension questions.

Procedure:

- Introduction of the objective and Think Pair Share question on borders in Central Europe.
- Students will activate prior knowledge by brainstorming assumed common knowledge of the Holocaust.
- Review of focal question options for students, including clarifying any misconceptions about the questions.
- Students will self select a focal question and will receive 4 different colored Post-Its and a graphic organizer to place the Post-Its on. Each Post-It will be used for a different section of the documentary for students to collect notes/evidence they will use to answer the question they have chosen as individuals.
- Pausing after each section, students will take their notes. *** Recommend pausing in the middle of Part 2 because of length.
- Students will be reorganized based on self-selected focal question (5 max per group), identify a group reporter and engage in a collaborative discussion of their answers to their question using the notes/evidence they had collected.
- Group share out. Clarifications as necessary.
- Lesson wrap –up. Students will select and reflect on one of three Digging Deeper Questions

Assessment: Students will be <u>assessed</u> through graphic organizers/notes, as well as observations of small group discussion and Digging Deeper answers.
