
Family Tree

Where and when were you born? Cakovec, 1929

Where else did you live? Zagreb

Your educational level? Two-year vocational trade school

What sort of work do/did you do? Economist in foreign trade

How religious was your parents' home? How were you raised? Not too religious: synagogue attendance every Friday night and Saturday, also for holidays. For Yom Kippur, my parents fasted all day, my sister and me until the noon. We didn't keep kosher. We lit candles for Hanukah, and for the deceased.

What is your mother tongue? Croatian; I spoke German with my father, and Hungarian with my maternal grandparents

How many languages do you speak? Hungarian, German, a bit of French and English *If you were in an army, tell us which army and the dates* JNA (Yugoslavian National Army) 1949 and 1950 in Ilirska Bistrica and Maribor

Where were you during the Holocaust?

April 1941-April 1944 in Cakovec under Hungarian occupation; from May 1944-January 1945 in Auschwitz (Misljovice); January 1945-April 1945 Dora Buchenwald; Bergen-Belsen

His/her educational level?5 year University degree in chemical engineering

Occupation? Professor in one of technological colleges in Zagreb

Their names? Tomislav

Were they raised Jewish/do they identify themselves as Jews? He wasn't raised Jewish. He is half-half and he doesn't identify himself as anything

Where and when were they born? Zagreb, 1958

Where else did they live? Basel, Switzerland

Their educational level? University degree, University of Zagreb, department of electro technology

Their occupations? Specialist in computer software private firm in Basel

How many grandchildren do you have? One granddaughter, Tea

His name? Emil Konstein

Where and when was he was born? Jihlava, Czech Republic, 1898

Where else did he live? Maribor, Slovenia; Cakovec

Where and when did he die? Auschwitz Buna, January 1945

What sort of education did he have? Vocational school for leather workers, Vienna

What sort of work did he do?

Assistant in family's leather factory in Maribor; owner of a leather store in Cakovec

How religious was he?

He attended services for Shabbat and holidays, not for weekdays; he wore a kipah only in synagogue not outside; he fasted for Yom Kippur but didn't observe kashrut

What was his mother tongue? German and Czech Army service: Which army and what years? Austro-Hungarian army, 1917 wounded in his back on the Italian front

Tell me about his brothers and sisters. (name, date of birth and death, occupation, place of residence, family, etc.) Two brothers: 1. Ernest, born 1890, died in Auschwitz 1944; 2. Vili, born 1900, no further information Four sisters: 1. Paula, born 1896, died in Auschwitz 1944; 2. Juli, born 1897, survived Theresienstadt, died in Brno 1976; 3. Lisel, no information on date of birth, married and lived in Vienna, she probably died in Auschwitz in 1944; 4. Erna, no information on date of birth, died in Auschwitz in 1944

Where was he during the Holocaust?

Until April 1944, he was in Cakovec under the Hungarian occupation; he was deported to Buna Auschwitz before my mother, sister and me; he was murdered in Auschwitz

If he survived, what did he do after?

Paternal grandfather

Your father's father name? Salomon Konstein

Where and when was he born? Place unknown, Czech Republic, 1856

Where else did he live? Maribor, Slovenia

Where and when did he die? Maribor, 1932, buried in Cakovec

What sort of education did he have? No information

What sort of work did he do? Leather-worker; later owner of a leather factory in Maribor

How religious was he? Not too religious: fasted for Yom Kippur, ate matzos for Passover, but didn't consume kosher food or observed Shabbat

What was his mother tongue? Czech and German

Army service: Which army and what years? No information Tell me about his brothers and sisters. (name, date of birth and death, occupation, place of residence, family, etc.) No information

Where was he during the Holocaust? Died before

Where else did she live? Maribor, Slovenia; Cakovec

Where and when did she die? Cakovec, 1943

What sort of education did she have? No information

What sort of work did she do? Housewife

How religious was she?

Not too religious: fasted for Yom Kippur and observed Passover but didn't keep kosher, didn't light candles for Shabbat but made sholet for every Shabbat

Where was she during the Holocaust?

In Cakovec under the Hungarian occupation; she died in 1943 of natural causes

Mother

Her name? Vilma Konstein, nee Heimer

Where and when was she born? Kotoriba, 1911

Where else did she live? Cakovec

Where and when did she die? Birkenau, 1944

What sort of education did she have? Completed 8 years of school; also completed a sewing course

What sort of work did she do? Housewife

How religious was she?

Not too religious: fasted for Yom Kippur, observed Passover but didn't keep kosher and didn't light candles for Shabbat; she lit candles for Hanukah and for the deceased

What was her mother tongue? Hungarian and Croatian

Tell me about her brothers and sisters. (name, date of birth and death, occupation, place of residence, family, etc.)

Two brothers: 1. Bela, born in 1902, killed in Jasenovac concentration camp in 1942, his wife Ivka and daughter Verica were killed in Loborgrad in 1941;Stjepan, born in 1904, his wife Greta (nee Cegledi) and son Stjepan, born in 1942, lived in Dalmacija and were saved, Stjepan died in Zagreb in 1987

Where was she during the Holocaust?

In Cakovec under the Hungarian occupation; killed in Birkenau, 1944

If she survived, what did she do after?

Maternal grandfather
