
Family Tree

How religious was your parents' home? How were you raised? I was raised in the traditional way. We celebrated Sabbath and every holiday, but it was more as a part of our culture and tradition then religiously. My father attended the synagogue every day.

Worked as nonkulo (attendant in synagogue) in Split, then as caretaker in the Jewish old-age home in Zagreb, then as community employee, then as cantor.
