

Where else did you live? Orhei, Kishinev (Chisinau in Moldovan); Rostov oblast, Stalingrad oblast (today Volgograd, Russia), Kant (today Kyrgyzstan)

Your educational level? Graduated from Kishinev Medical Institute, Psychotherapeutic Department

What sort of work do/did you do? Psychotherapist in a polyclinic

How religious was your parents' home? How were you raised? My parents were rather religious, went to the synagogue on holidays, covered their head, observed the kashrut and Sabbath traditions, celebrated Jewish holidays. Father prayed daily.

*What is your mother tongue?* Yiddish

What other languages do you speak? Romanian/Moldovan, Russian, English Where were you during the Holocaust? Evacuation: Rostov oblast, Stalingrad oblast (today Volgograd, Russia), Kant (today Kyrgyzstan)

## What did you do after the Holocaust?

Came back to Moldova, graduated from the institute, got married, raised children, worked as a doctor
