Mr. Grynberg's father and mother never saw each other before the wedding. It was an arranged marriage. His mother's parents hired an official shadkhan, that is a matchmaker. His mother was very religious and behaved religiously. She used to wear a sheitl, a wig. Mr. Grynberg's parents loved each other very much. As religious people, they always respected each other and spoke to each other elegantly. *What is your mother tongue?* Yiddish

How many other languages do you speak? Seven: Polish, German, Hebrew, Spanish, Portuguese, Russian, French

If you were in an army, tell us which army and the dates

Mr. Grynberg never served in the army.

What did you do after the Holocaust?

After having spent one year in the Soviet Union he came back to Poland in 1946. He then moved to Israel, France, Brazil, Germany and Spain. He returned to Poland in 1987.

Mr. Grynberg's Father was a Ger Chasid. He attended the synagogue service at Kabalat Sabbath, as well as the Sabbath morning prayers. He observed all Jewish holidays and religious customs (for example he went to the mikveh every Friday afternoon). As a young man he injured himself in order not to be mobilized to the tsarist army, since he did not want to eat non-kosher food. He kept kosher all his life. What was his mother tongue? Yiddish

During WWII she fled to the USSR and settled in an industry-town in the Ural, Magnitogorsk. There she organized a prayer room for orthodox Jews and helped in funeral preparations. Having moved to Israel in the late 1940s, she settled in Bnei Brak. *What was her mother tongue?* Yiddish
