

3 sisters and 2 brothers, all in Chita:

Lidia Deribizova (1894 -1936): equipment operator, died in exile in Khabarovsk. Daughter Olga lives in St Petersburg.

Konstantin Deribizov (1896-1919): executed in Chita by the Whites during the Civil War Liubov Deribizova (1898-1968): librarian, married, Siberia.

Nikolay Deribizov (1902-1938): worked on the railroad, shot by the NKVD in Chita, two sons remained.

Tatyana Deribizova (1904-1962): dressmaker in Charbin (China). Emigrated to Australia and died there. Director of a retirement home for former Russian citizens. Husband was Chinese, Vladimir Yao, died in Japan. They had two sons: Vladimir (died in Irkutsk, 2000) and Konstantin (lives in Rostov-on-the-Don).

1 brother and 4 sisters, all born in Nerchinsk and died in Leningrad.

Yakov Goldberg (1892-1965): book-keeper, married, no children.

Rakhil Yoffe (nee Goldberg) (1895-1942): housewife, husband, Genrikh Yoffe, he died in 1945 from dystrophy, no children.

Shifra Golumb (nee Goldberg) (1900–1982): book-keeper, husband, Gdali Golumb, daughter died at the age of 5.

Liya Goldberg (kept maiden name) (1903–1968): archivist, husband, Levi Golumb. Son Gdali died in the Leningrad blockade .

Debora Goldberg (1907–1993): budget planner, accountant, daughter Irina, died in 1989.
