

How religious was he?

He knew the history of the Jewish people, as well as the religious holidays. He was not a believer though he observed the traditions as far as possible: attended the synagogue on fall holidays, celebrated Pesakh. He turned to faith not long before his death

What was his mother tongue? Russian, but spoke Yiddish very well Army service: Which army and what years?

He had 6 half-brothers and 2 half-sisters on his father's side, and a sister on his mother's side:

1)Moisey (1882, Vitebsk – 1947, Kuibyshev (present name Samara)). timber merchant; married a Jew, daughter Gita, a doctor.

2)Isaac (1894-1966). Lived in Vitebsk and Gomel, commercial manager of a chocolate factory in Gomel.

3)Fanya (1870s, Vitebsk - 1940s, Moscow). Lived in Leningrad.

4)Beilya (1877, Vitebsk -1940s, Leningrad). Married a Jew, daughter Sara, son Mikhail. Died in besieged Leningrad.

Other four of them emigrated to America in the 1910s and I know nothing more about them.

1) Khana (1907-1993). Teacher of chorus singing, lived in Vitebsk and Leningrad.

She had 2 sisters and 1 brother:

- 2) Lilya (Liya) (1908, Vitebsk 1954). Worked at a factory before the war, after the war was a housewife, lived in Leningrad; married a Jew, a career officer (perished in World War II), daughter Nelya, son Boris.
- 3) Lev (1904-1942). Perished at the front at the very beginning of the war.
