


Family Tree

1937-1941; 1945-1948: secondary school №2 of Bryansk
1948-1952: Faculty of French Language at Moscow Regional Pedagogical Institute named after Krupskaya

What sort of work do/did you do?

1953-1965: teacher of French in school №2, Bryansk
1965-1984: teacher of French in Bryansk Institute of Transportation Machinery

What was the level of religiosity in your parent's home? How were you raised?

Father was from a religious family, finished a cheder, studied in a yeshivah. The family tried to observe Jewish traditions until parents' death. In my childhood Father took me with him to a synagogue.

What is your mother tongue?

Yiddish, Russian

Where and when was he was born?

Pogar, 1902

Where else did he live?

Seredina Buda (today Ukraine); Bryansk

Where and when did he die?

Bryansk, 1986

What sort of education did he have?

1905-?: cheder in Pogar; Yeshivah; Courses of accountants in Bryansk
1935-1938: the All-Union Correspondence Institute of Economics and Finance of the People's Commissariat of Finance of the USSR.

What sort of work did he do?

?-?: forestry contractor in Seredina Buda
?-?: chief accountant of the Regional Trade Department
?-1963: chief of local industries crediting department of the State Bank in Bryansk

What was his level of religiosity?

Having obtained a religious education in his youth, he wasn't really religious in his life. After his retirement he attended the synagogue from time to time, read religious literature.

What was his mother tongue?

Yiddish

Army service: Which army and what years?

Fought in the 50th Army, which was formed in Bryansk and liberated Bryansk in September 1943.

Tell me about his brothers and sisters. (name, date of birth and death, occupation, place of residence, family, etc.)

Two brothers and six sisters: Eine, Iosif, Hana, Sora-Mere, Fruma-Riva, Pesya, Genya and Chasya.

Eine Frumkin (?-?): the eldest brother, was a hatter; his son Faivel died in Bryansk in the 1990s, the second son Veniamin lives in Bryansk with his family

Iosif Frumkin (?-1940s): profession unknown, died in evacuation; wife Haya-Dveira

Hana ? (nee Frumkina) (?-?): (stepsister), lived in Bryansk region, housewife, children and grandchildren are now in Israel;

Pesya Frumkina (?-?): single, housewife, before the war worked as a sales person in Bryansk

Zhenya Kats (nee Frumkina) (?-?): housewife, husband Samuil Kats, no children, lived in Bryansk

Chasya Khazanov (nee Frumkina) (?-?): Moscow, secretary of Lazar Kaganovich, husband – Abram Khazanov, died at the front, son Mark lives in Bryansk with his family.

Fruma-Riva Getmanskaya (nee Frumkina) (?-ca. 1917): died in the course of a pogrom in Bryansk region, husband Mark Getmansky and two daughters survived. The elder daughter Eugenia (Zhenya) and her son died in Bryansk in the 1970s, and the younger daughter Chasya and her children and grandchildren live in Bryansk.

Sora-Mere Frumkina (nee Frumkina) (?-?): housewife, she was married to her cousin Isaak, they lived in Kharbin (today China). In the 1930s they moved from

Kharbin to Australia. Their son Mosya owned a bookshop in Australia, his son Philip's son is a student in Tel Aviv (today Israel) now.

Where was he during the Holocaust?

Fought in the 50th Army, which was formed in Bryansk and liberated Bryansk in September 1943.

Chief accountant of the Regional Trade Department

Pogar, 1860s.

He was a melamed all his life, wandering around settlements and teaching children.

He was a deeply religious Orthodox Jew.

Gita Moiseevna Frumkina (nee Goz)

Where and when was she was born?

Radul, Kiev province (today Ukraine), 1903

Where else did she live?

Mglin, Chernigov province (today Ukraine); Bryansk

Bryansk, 1979

Courses of accounting in Bryansk

What sort of work did she do?

Worked as an accountant before 1927, but concentrated on the housekeeping after her daughter was born.

What was her level of religiosity?

Led a secular life

What was her mother tongue?

Yiddish

Tell me about her brothers and sisters. (name, date of birth and death, occupation, place of residence, family, etc.)

She had three brothers: Semen, Aron and Zalman.

Semen Moiseevich Goz (?-1970s, Bryansk): Radul, pharmacist, single, served in the Tsarist Army, later took part in the storm of the Winter Palace [residence of the Russian Tsars] in 1917. After moving to Bryansk he was the director of the central drugstore.

Aron Goz-Livshits (?-?) lived in Bryansk, worked as the director of the drugstore at Regional Hospital.

Zalman Moiseevich Goz (?-1940s) also was a pharmacist, died at the front. Son Abram lived with his family in Bryansk, left for Manhattan (USA), in 1990s.
