

Rosa was not as religious as her mother and father because of her life circumstances. During the war it was necessary to adapt to Soviet reality. It was impossible for her to observe traditions having a professional soldier, a former commissar as a husband and living in a military camp, and it was not welcomed by people around her. Keeping in memory her family traditions, Rosa whenever possible tried to cook something for Jewish holidays, to light candles - but that was all she could do. Russian

Avraham was really religious, he strictly observed the kashrut (even when he stayed in hospital because of an operation, he did not eat hospital meals – his daughters prepared and brought him kosher meals). He spoke to his daughters only Yiddish. He spoke poor Russian with a marked accent. He had a broad and thick beard, wore black Jewish clothes, a kippah and a hat. He took his children to the synagogue every Saturday. A lot of people visited him in his house asking for his advice and assistance. He tried to help everyone, gave them food. An unusually great number of visitors gathered at his place during holidays.
