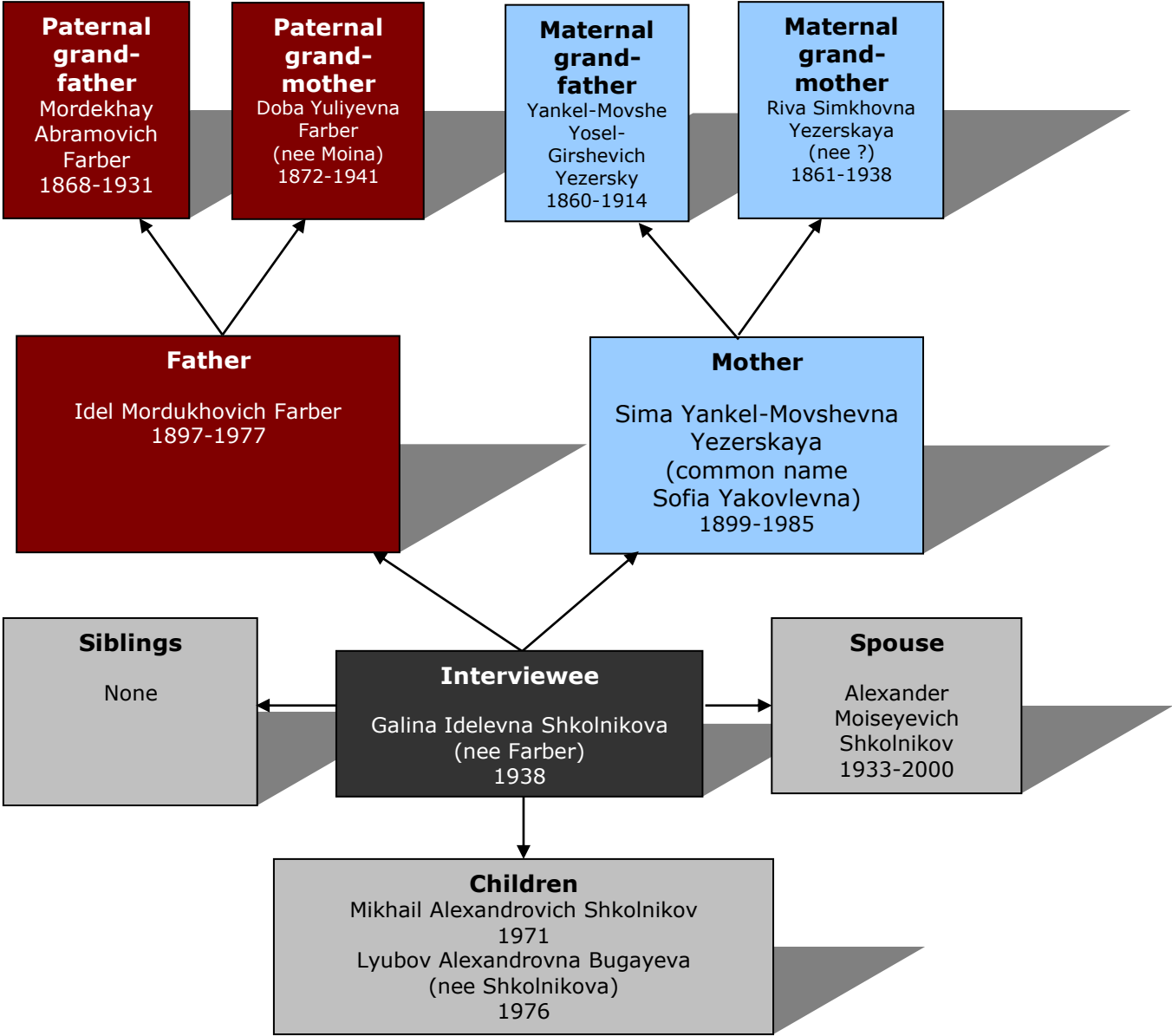

He had 3 brothers and 3 sisters:

Sarah Shvechenko (nee Farber) (1898-1968): veterinarian, lived in Nikopol, Dnepropetrovsk and Moscow. Her husband was Russian, they had 3 children: Kima, Alvina and Leonid.

David Markovich Farber (1900-1980): economist, lived in Nikopol and Moscow. He was married to a Jewish book-keeper. They were in evacuation in Siberia. Their son, Yuriy, was in the book trade.

Isaac Matveyevich Farber (1902-1937): engineer, lived in Nikopol, Baku (Azerbaijan) and Moscow. His wife, Rimma Lvovna Chernyaeva, was Jewish. They had no children. Isaac died of cancer in Moscow.

Abram Matveyevich Farber (1904-1967): engineer, lived in Nikopol and Moscow, was on the front. His wife was Moldavian and they had 2 children, both were engineers.

Revekka Matveyevna Farber (1906-1970): epidemiologist, lived in Nikopol and Leningrad. During WWII she was in the blockade in Leningrad. Her husband was Russian, she kept her maiden name after the wedding and has one daughter, Victoria.

Rakhil Matveyevna Farber (1909): production engineer, wine-maker; lived in Nikopol, Voronezh, Lvov and Moscow. Her husband, Abram Davidovich Gilevich, was a Jewish merchant. She kept her maiden name after the wedding. They were in evacuation in Siberia. At present Rakhil lives in Moscow with her daughter Eleonora's family.

She had 2 brothers and 3 sisters:

Froim-Peisakh Yankel-Movshevich Yezersky (1879-1956): 1st Guild

merchant, owner of a store in Kharkov, Ukraine, seller in the store after its nationalization. He was in evacuation in Alma-Ata (Kazakhstan) and died in Kharkov. His wife, Fruma-Peisha Shlyome-Ziskelevna, was a housewife. They had 3 children: Matvey, Feiga (engineers) and Masha (doctor).

Iosif Yankel-Movshevich Yezersky (1880s-1937): merchant, store owner in Yekaterinoslav, Ukraine, commercial agent in Kharkov after the nationalization of the store. He was married twice, had 2 children from his first marriage and one son from his second marriage.

Feiga Yankel Movshevna Liberman (nee Yezerskaya) (1886-1960s): housewife. Her husband, Alter Liberman, died in 1937. She lived in Yekaterinoslav and Kharkov, was in evacuation. Had 2 sons: Abram and Zinoviy (wife Nina and daughter Larisa). Both her sons were in the war.

Shprintsa-Rokhel Yezerskaya (1896-1941): dentist, graduated from university in Lausanne (Switzerland), lived in Brest-Litovsk, Belarus. She perished in the ghetto with her husband and 2 children, Abram and Bella, in 1941.

Lyuba Finkel (nee Yezerskaya) (1897-1963): housewife. Her first husband was an actor. Her second husband, Beinish Finkel (Boris Aronovich), owned a plant during the NEP, and later they both worked in cooperatives. They had a daughter, Irina, born in 1923. Lyuba lived in Yekaterinoslav, Kharkov and Leningrad, was in evacuation in the Ural and died in Leningrad.
