


Family Tree

Doba ? (nee Kogan) (1860s–1941): housewife, married, twelve children, perished in Odessa ghetto in 1941 with her husband and four children

Semyon Kogan (1885–1941): supply agent, wife Clara, daughter Murah, all killed in Odessa in 1941

Polia Shwalboim (nee Kogan) (1887–1975): seamstress, Odessa, husband Grigory Shwalboim, owner of a fabric store; two children: the son Musia and the daughter Lyonia live in Israel

Natan Kogan (1890s–1980s): Odessa, wife Dora, two children: the son perished at the front in Poland in 1945, the daughter lives in the USA

Naum Kogan (1890s–1941): Odessa, wife Lusya, daughter Jeanne; he was killed either in Territorial army or in Odessa ghetto

Fenia ? (nee Kogan) (1899–1960s): seamstress, Odessa, married, children: none
